### Dear Friends

I am writing this whilst enjoying the warmth of September but looking ahead to October and the arrival of autumn and winter this year, with very mixed feelings. By the end of the month clocks will have gone back, curtains will be closed earlier and earlier in the day, there might have been an autumn gale or two, and the heating will probably have been switched on. Summer will seem a distant memory. That though is the beauty of the seasons. We think of the year being defined into quarters but rather it changes incrementally and sometimes imperceptibly every day of the year.

This is a year that has taught me many things and I am still tentatively learning to live and function on my own without Richard by my side, in and amongst memories which either completely floor me or fill me gratitude and a small smile. This is a year that has demonstrated to me the goodness of others both in this Benefice and beyond. The kindness shown to my daughters and myself has been so thoughtful; gentle words when you have seen us and small demonstrations of physical warmth and touch. Hugs really have helped. They have helped us not to forget what has happened this year but to encourage us to continue living our lives as we know Richard would have wanted us to I know he would have been so proud that after many years of training both as a Reader and then latterly as a priest, Bishops Martin and Mike have confirmed that my curacy has been completed, and I am now an Associate Priest, your Associate Priest.

I can reflect on what I do next and guided by God I have made the decision to visit Kagera, our link diocese in Tanzania. In February 2024 ten of us from the diocese are travelling together, each with our own agendas (mine is to witness how aid is delivered and used, and the role of chaplains) but with a common goal of having our lives transformed and to witness worship both in new formats and new settings. I feel there will be quite a few good starting points for sermons when I return!

I pray and hope the arrival of autumn and eventually winter doesn't fill you with complete dread and that you will see God's beauty not only in our harvest celebrations, but also in the chill winds and in the soaking rain and puddles. Our lives are never straightforward but may God's guiding hand support all of us as we journey through each day and season.



As I write these notes (mid-September) we have just enjoyed (or endured) another hot to very hot fortnight and once again the watering especially of pots started in earnest once again. Don't know about you but for me it brought back memories of May & June 2022, but fortunately not for so long, and the heat not so record breaking. A few timely heavy showers has since refreshed things up a bit and I must say the gardens look in fine fettle. 

### Salted caramel and roasted pecan brownie. (makes 12)

### Brownie mix

250g unsalted butter

250g dark chocolate

175g plain flour

75g cocoa powder

5 eggs

300g golden caster sugar

### Salted pecan praline

200g pecan nut halves

1 tea spoon sea salt

150g caster sugar

50 ml water

### Stage 1

- Line a square or rectangle 20cm cake tin with buttered or oiled parchment paper.
   And pre heat a fan assisted oven to 180c
- Roast the pecan nuts with the salt @ 180c for 7mins then remove and place on parchment paper.
- In a thick bottom or copper pan boil up the caster sugar, and water to 180c and pour over the nuts, allow this cool then smash into pieces with a rolling pin or alternatively use a food processor on pulse.



### Stage 2

- Melt the chocolate and butter together, mixing well all the time over a bain marie, or in 30 second blasts in a microwave, until fully melted and smooth.
- Sieve the flour and cocoa powder and fold into the above melted chocolate and butter, allow 10 minutes for this to cool, then fold through the pecan praline from stage 1.

### Stage 3

- 1. Beat the eggs and golden caster sugar to sabayon stage (thick & pale)
- Now fold the stage 2 chocolate nut paste through the egg and sugar mixture (sabayon).
- Pour the mixture into the lined cake tin and proceed to bake for 50mins at 180c, remove from the oven and leave the brownie in the tin to cool before removing and portioning.

### **Memories**

Having read last month how the magazine is constructed, memories from the past were brought back.

My father John Griffin (Rector 1946-1972) decided that money could be saved by making the Stratford & Higham Parish Magazine in house. Mrs. Hughes, from Stratford Hills Farm, supported the village a lot and donated a Gestetner Duplicator. This was a hand powered machine which could print from a type written copy. A modern method in the 1950s with no type setting to be done.

Father built a work top with cupboard and drawers to fit his study in the Rectory. The old Rectory is on the corner where School Lane meets the A12, which then ran through the village. Father had learnt to type at that time, one finger on each hand. and Miss Jean Sharp came over for a few evenings towards the end of the month. She would type the material which he had written onto a stencil for the duplicator. This entailed hitting the type keys very hard to cut into the stencil, if not hard enough bits failed to print. The stencil for each page was fitted to the machine, ink was poured in and the handle was turned. It made a satisfying wurring and clicking noise until the right number of pages were reached. Then it was up to the volunteers who descended on the Rectory to put the pages together in the right order, and staple together with an extra long tool which could reach the middle of an A4 sheet from the end. Then it was delivered to the villagers who subscribed to it.

### Suffolk clinician publishes book on supporting parents with their child's mental health

One of the UK's most experienced and respected consultant clinical psychologists – who's based in Suffolk – has published a new book that aims to support parents with their children's mental health.

Happy Families: How to protect and support your child's mental health, written by Dr Beth Mosley MBE, aims to equip parents and carers with the tools they need to tackle anxiety, low mood and difficult behaviours among young people.

The book has received international interest from a number of countries including the USA, France and Greece.

Dr Mosley said: "With the school summer holidays drawing to a close and the start of a new academic school year, September can often be a challenging time for children of all ages.

"It's not easy being a parent at the moment. We've just navigated an unexpected pandemic and continue to face other ongoing uncertainties that impact both our stress levels and our children's.

"We are hearing it all the time, how children's mental health difficulties are massively increasing and there are limited services to help.

"As a parent your anxiety goes through the roof when you hear that 50% of mental health difficulties in adulthood start before the age of 15 and 75% before 24.

"Happy Families has been inspired by the many families I have worked with over the years.

"The information I have shared with these families has made such a difference to them and their children's lives."

Beth added: "Surprisingly, despite the fact that there has never been a time when children's mental health has been of so much interest to parents, there is not a book out there that provides this critical information in one place. Which is what inspired me to write this book.

"Happy Families is packed with the most important things every parent needs to know about their child's mental health. And it's not just why, it is what to do – it provides the practical tools for parents to support their children from ages 4 through to 21. Based on 20 years of experience as a clinician and a parent it is a jargon-free warm companion and guide to any parent in what can sometimes feel like a lonely journey.

"Young people's mental health is not just an area of concern for parents in the UK, it is a global challenge. Happy Families will be published in many different languages, including Korean, French, Spanish, Polish, Chinese, Romanian and Greek. It is also to be published in the USA."

Dr Mosley was one of the first clinical psychologists in the country to be appointed full-time within a local secondary school. She works locally for the NHS both as a children's and young people's mental health clinical lead and a consultant clinical psychologist in children's mental health services.

Her contribution to children's mental health during the pandemic was recognised in the 2022 New Year's Honours List with an MBE.


